Information for the Problem

Charlene J. Fagan, whose Social Security number is 489-20-2016, is a 47year-old divorced taxpayer who moved to 2016 Gafford Lane, St. Louis, Missouri 63146 during 2016. She had previously lived in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She provides 90% of the support of her 16-year-old daughter, Elissa Rae Fagan, whose Social Security number is 506-06-0616, and her 14-year-old son, David Andrew Fagan whose Social Security number is 409-09-0916.

Charlene is employed as a regional sales manager for Zerocks, Inc., of St. Louis and was transferred by her employer during January of 2016. Her 2016 Form W-2 is provided.
